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CPI July 2020 - HIGHLIGHTS

The overall Consumer Price Index (CPI) in July 2020 has **increased** by 2.0 per cent year-on-year from 98.9 in July 2019 to 100.9 this year. Both Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages and Non-Food index have recorded an increase of 2.2 per cent and 1.9 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the index Goods, and the index of Services have increased by 1.4 per cent and 2.7 per cent respectively.

On a month-on-month basis, the CPI has **decreased** by 0.1 per cent compared to June 2020; whereby both Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages and Non-Food index have recorded a decrease of 0.4 per cent and 0.02 per cent.

For period-on-period, the CPI for January to July 2020 registered an increase of 1.9 per cent compared to the same period last year (**Table 1**).



YEAR-ON-YEAR CHANGES (July 2020 compared to July 2019)

The CPI in July 2020 has increased by 2.0 per cent compared to the same month in 2019.

Among the major groups which recorded increases were the indices for Miscellaneous Goods and Services (10.6 per cent); Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (2.2 per cent); and Transport (2.2 per cent) (Figure 1).

Based on the contribution to change, Miscellaneous Goods and Services has contributed 41.3 per cent to the overall year-on-year increase of the CPI in July 2020. This was followed by Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (21.3 per cent); and Transport (20.1 per cent) (Table 2).

Increases were recorded in:

- **Miscellaneous Goods and Services** (10.6 per cent) due to increased prices of insurance; other services as well as jewellery, clocks and watches;
- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (2.2 per cent) due to increased prices of mineral waters, soft drinks, fruits and vegetable juices; vegetables as well as meat (Table 3); and
- **Transport** (2.2 per cent) due to increased prices of prices of passenger transport by passenger transport by road as well as passenger transport by air of a few limited flights.

Decreases were recorded in:

- Restaurants and Hotels (1.1 per cent) due to decreased prices of accommodation services; and
- **Recreation and Culture** (0.2 per cent) due to decreased prices of package holidays/pilgrimages; equipment for the reception, recording and reproduction of sound and picture as well as recreational and sporting services.



MONTH-ON-MONTH CHANGES (July 2020 compared to June 2020)

The CPI in May 2020 has decreased by 0.1 per cent over June 2020.

The indices which recorded decreases were Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (0.4 per cent); Clothing and Footwear (1.2 per cent); and Miscellaneous Goods and Services (0.04 per cent) (Figure 2).

Based on the contribution to change, Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages has contributed 84.6 per cent to the overall month-on-month decrease of the CPI in July 2020. This was followed by Clothing and Footwear (59.2 per cent); and Miscellaneous Goods and Services (4.4 per cent) (Table 4).

Decreases were recorded in:

- Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (0.4 per cent) due to decreased prices of vegetables; fruits as well as meat;
- Clothing and Footwear (1.2 per cent) due to decrease in prices of clothing material as well as garments; and
- **Miscellaneous Goods and Services** (0.04 per cent) due to decreased prices of other appliances articles and products for personal care.

Increases were recorded in:

- Furnishings, household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (0.2 per cent) due to increased prices
 of household textiles;
- Recreation and Culture (0.2 per cent) due to increase prices of pet and related products; package holiday as well as stationery and drawing materials; and
- Restaurant and Hotels (0.1 per cent) due to increased prices of accommodation services.

Meanwhile, the indices for Communication; and Education remain unchanged.

PERIOD-ON-PERIOD CHANGES (January-July 2020 compared to January-July 2019)

The average CPI for the first seven months (January to July) of 2020 has increased by 1.9 per cent year-on-year compared to the same period in 2019 (Table 5).

Increases were recorded in Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages (2.0 per cent); Clothing and Footwear (3.9 per cent); Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Household Maintenance (2.7 per cent); Health (0.8 per cent); Communication (0.03 per cent); Recreation and Culture (0.4 per cent); Education (1.8 per cent); Restaurants and Hotels (1.7 per cent); and Miscellaneous Goods and Services (11.3 per cent).

On the other hand, decreases were recorded in Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels (0.4 per cent); and Transport (0.1 per cent).

Goods according to Durability and Services

For July 2020, the indices for durable goods, semi-durable goods, non-durable goods and services have increased year-on-year by 0.6, 3.8, 1.2 and 2.7 per cent, respectively.

Compared to June 2020, the indices for semi-durable goods and non-durable goods have decreased by 0.3 and 0.2 per cent, respectively. Meanwhile, the indices for durable goods as well as services have increased by 0.01 and 0.02 per cent, respectively.

For the period January to July 2020, the indices of goods and services increased by 1.1 and 2.9 per cent, respectively compared to the same period last year (**Table 6**).
